



Capital Improvement Endowment Fund 2010 Information and Application Form

Introduction

Through the generous gifts of its members, Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church of Waterville, Ohio, is pleased to offer grants for Capital Improvement at Zion. Zion's Endowment Committee administers the Fund through an application process.

The following information explains the application process and timetable. All applications must be in writing and all information must be provided. All applications must be **submitted** and **sponsored** by an active member of Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church. In the interest of efficiency and uniformity, the Endowment Committee will evaluate all requests based on written applications rather than personal interviews with applicants.

Categories

The Endowment Committee is looking for Capital Improvement proposals that do not increase Zion's operational expenses. The Committee is looking for Capital Improvements that will stimulate and facilitate **God's work**. The Committee has an interest in furthering Zion's mission and ministry as a partner in Christ. The Committee also has an interest in stretching the funds available through a matching grant approach. The Committee will consider and evaluate all appropriate grant applications in the following categories:

1. Projects that will increase attendance.
2. Projects that will improve the quality of worship.
3. Projects that will reduce operating costs.
4. Projects that will reduce other costs.

2010 Dates

All grant applications must be submitted to the Committee between January 10 and March 7. The Committee will review all applications by May 10. After May 10, ballots will be prepared and mailed to all congregation members to vote on the proposed projects. All ballots that are properly returned and verified by July 12 will be counted and compiled by the Endowment Committee. The Endowment Committee will report the voting results to the Congregation in early September. Disbursements will be made as required by the nature and timing of the project, beginning in October.

Amounts not disbursed after one year will be returned to the Capital Improvement Endowment Fund.

Procedure

The Endowment Committee will review applications before May 10 to determine if they meet the grant criteria. Qualifying applications will be reviewed and must be approved by the Committee in order to be presented to the congregation for voting. If there are no appropriate applications submitted, none will be presented.

Funding

Application proposals should be limited to no more than \$5,000 per request. It is anticipated that the Capital Improvement Endowment Fund will provide approximately \$12,000 on an annual basis. This amount will be allocated among the appropriate categories listed above. The amounts allocated to each project will depend upon the number of approved applications, how they match the capital improvement objectives, and the results of the Congregation vote. Additionally, any project appearing on the ballot may receive full, partial or no funding.

Application

EACH APPLICATION FOR A GRANT FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT ENDOWMENT FUND MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY AN APPROPRIATE APPLICATION FROM THE SAME MEMBER(S) FOR A GRANT FROM THE MISSION ENDOWMENT FUND.

The applicant for a grant from the Capital Improvement Endowment Fund must be an active member of Zion. The application form must be filled out in its entirety. Additional information, which the applicant wishes to supply, should be attached to the application. The application must be completed by March 7 to be considered for funding in October.
